Newest Echocardiogram Technology

Penn Medicine Lancaster General Health is committed to providing patients and the community access to the most advanced medicine possible. In April, the health system replaced its fleet of 23 ultrasound machines to provide the most advanced 3-D cardiology ultrasound (echocardiogram or echo) technology.

The new Philips EPIQ CVx 3-D machines provide superior 3-D image quality to better diagnose cardiac conditions like pulmonary hypertension, congenital heart disease, coronary disease, heart failure, and cancer therapy-related cardiac dysfunction.

The machines, which are enhanced with AI technology, help the cardiac sonographers see all angles of the heart, leading to more enhanced images and more efficient reviews.

"This new ultrasound technology provides the highest level of care for our cardiology patients and reinforces that Penn Medicine Lancaster General Health is the premier cardiology provider in our region," said **Tim Zellers**, executive director, Lancaster Heart & Vascular Institute. The new technology is available at LG Health facilities where cardiac ultrasounds are offered, including each ambulatory center. The highest volume of the new machines is located at The Heart Group at the Harrisburg Pike location and at Lancaster General Hospital Duke Street. Work is also underway to establish a site at the Suburban Pavilion to provide ease of access to echocardiograms for oncology patients at the Ann B. Barshinger Institute (ABBCI).

"The collaboration between the LG Health Heart & Vascular team and ABBCI is imperative as certain chemotherapy medications are known to have a negative effect on heart function," said **Scott Trunzo**, director, Non-Invasive Cardiology and Rehab Services. "The ideal care for our cancer patients is to be first seen by a cardiologist before starting chemotherapy treatment – having a location adjacent to the Cancer Institute provides the most convenient option for our patients," Trunzo continued.

LG Health and the entire Penn Medicine health system are committed to advancing health equity for everyone in our community. I would like to provide an update on our progress in some key areas of focus.

- LG Health recently received the highest possible rating in the Human Rights Campaign Foundation's National LGBTQ Healthcare Equality Index. Our designation as an LGBTQ+ Healthcare Equality Leader reflects our commitment to providing supportive, affirming care to our LGBTQ+ patients and their families, as well as an inclusive workplace and community outreach.
- Our COVID-19 vaccine community clinics increase access for the diverse communities
 we serve, vaccinating more than 4,000 people to date in convenient and comfortable
 settings, including churches, affordable housing complexes, community centers, schools
 and fire halls.
- Through our Lead-Free Families program, LG Health has made a 10-year, \$50 million commitment to address housing health and safety by measurably reducing the presence and impact of lead in more than 2,800 Lancaster County homes.
- Our school-based health clinics serve all students, faculty and staff within the School District of Lancaster, providing 3,073 visits so far this school year. About 75% of patients have Medical Assistance or are uninsured.
- LG Health's Food Farmacy program provides nutrition counseling and healthy food
 options for patients with nutrition-related health conditions who meet income limits and
 are unable to access enough food to live an active, healthy life. Our additional \$2.9 million
 investment over the next five years will enable the program's continued expansion.

While we have made significant progress in our efforts to advance health equity, there is still much work to be done. Thank you for your continued support and commitment as we work together to ensure that everyone in our community has an opportunity to achieve their full health potential.

LG Health Providers Advocate for PREFERRED PRONOUN VISIBIL

Preferred pronouns indicate a person's gender for which they identify and how they wish to be identified by others which may or may not differ from their sex assigned at birth. Commonly used gender pronouns include he/him/his, she/her/ hers, they/them/theirs, or a combination of pronouns. Respecting an individual's preferred gender pronouns is important in everyday life and health-care settings to help the patient feel safe and acknowledge that their gender identity will be respected as part of their care.

While patients have been able to affirm their sexual orientation, sex assigned at birth, and gender identity through their MyLGHealth accounts, providers did not have a way to identify their preferred pronouns with patients. Recently providers advocated for their preferred gender pronouns to be visible on "Find a Doctor," Penn Medicine Lancaster General Health's online listing of providers. Find a Doctor provides community members access to search online for the physician or healthcare provider that is right for them.

"I added my pronouns to my "Find a Doctor" site to show allyship with the LGBTQ+ patients I care for," said Jeffrey R. Martin, MD, Chair, Department of Family and Community Medicine. "It is just one way for me as a physician to recognize and signal that I am a safe provider, and I will try my best, in a non-biased way, to recognize the varied gender identities and sexual orientations of my patients. And in a small way it helps

alleviate the potential fear

and vulnerability that LGBTQ+ persons sometimes feel when accessing health care resources."

The LG Health Web Services team, which oversees LG Health's Find a Doctor application, collaborated with colleagues across Penn Medicine to expand this change beyond LG Health.
