Free to Breathe is a partnership of lung cancer survivors, advocates, researchers, healthcare professionals and industry leaders united in the belief that every person with lung cancer deserves a cure. The mission of Free to Breathe is to ensure surviving lung cancer is the expectation, not the exception, and their vision is to double lung cancer survival by 2022. To turn this vision into reality, Free to Breathe focuses on funding research with the greatest potential to save lives, increasing the number of lung cancer patients participating in clinical trials, and building and empowering the lung cancer community. Since 2001, Free to Breathe has funded over 5 million dollars in lung cancer research. Free to Breathe is a 501(c) 3 non-profit organization headquartered in Madison, WI.
